香港建設資產及環境信息管理聯盟與智慧城市聯盟 就促進完善建設資產及環境信息及相關科技的管理 簽署諒解備忘錄

(2021年11月23日)香港建設資產及環境信息管理聯盟 (HKABAEIMA)(以下簡稱"信息管理聯盟")今天慶祝成立兩週 年,並與智慧城市聯盟(SCC)就共同推動香港的建設資產及環 境信息及相關科技的管理簽署諒解備忘錄。

發展局常任秘書長(規劃及地政) 甯漢豪女士在簽署典禮上致辭時表示,數碼數據基建在提升發展項目的質素和建造業標準非常重要,因此政府正推出多項舉措,推進建設資產行業的發展和有關地理空間數據的創新使用。她說,發展局在創科局及其他決策局/部門的支持下,在建立「空間數據共享平台」入門網站方面的工作穩步進展,計劃該入門網站會在2022年年底前發放多個部門超過320個空間數據集。

HKABAEIMA and SCC signed MoU to foster better management of built asset, environment information and associated technologies

(23 November 2021) The Hong Kong Alliance of Built Asset & Environment Information Management Associations (HKABAEIMA) celebrated its second anniversary today and signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Smart City Consortium (SCC) to collaborate in promoting better management of built asset and environment information and associated technologies in Hong Kong.

At the signing ceremony, Permanent Secretary for Development (Planning and Lands) Bernadette Linn said the importance of digital data infrastructure in enhancing the quality of developments and construction standards cannot be more obvious. Keenly aware of this fact, the Government is taking forward various initiatives to facilitate the development of the built asset industry and the innovative use of geospatial data. She said the Development Bureau, with the support from the Innovation and Technology Bureau as well as other bureaux/departments, has been making steady progress in building the CSDI. More than 320 datasets of spatial data, contributed by different departments, are targeted to be released on the proposed portal by the end of 2022, said Ms Linn.

The MoU was signed by HKABAEIMA's President Ar Ada Fung and SCC's President Gary Yeung, at the witness of Bernadette Linn and SCC's Founder and Honorary President Dr Winnie Tang.

Ar Ada Fung said HKABAEIMA upholds the vision to foster societal collaboration for smarter information management across built asset and environment, and the vision of buildingSMART to enable full benefits from digital ways of working in the built asset industry. "I look forward to collaborating closer with Smart City Consortium to advance the frontiers of built asset industry, helping to enable digital transformation for Smart City development, with open digital information flows across the built asset

economy." said Ada Fung, President of HKABAEIMA cum Chair of Hong Kong Chapter of buildingSMART.

Pursuant to the MoU, both HKABAEIMA and SCC will promote and advance the general education and understanding of built asset and environment information management by organising training or experience sharing seminars.

SCC will support HKABEIMA's efforts in developing the standards and best practices for deploying and maintaining better management of built asset and environment information and associated technologies in Hong Kong.

Mr Gary Yeung said the SCC are collaborating with the HKABEIMA with the intention to make Hong Kong a more liveable smart city. He said, "It is also our vision to position Hong Kong as a leader within the Greater Bay Area in areas of management of built asset and environment information and associated technologies."

Both parties will launch promotion activities around a Hong Kong smart city vision to generate appreciation in built asset and environment information modelling management.
